Visiting Neighbors enables anyone over the age of 60 to remain a vital part of the New York community. Through programs of "neighbors helping neighbors," volunteers, supported by Visiting Neighbors' professional staff, help older adults alleviate loneliness and isolation, provide mental stimulation and security, and encourage physical independence and quality of life at home. Visiting Neighbors serves New Yorkers in Gramercy Park, Chelsea, the East and West Village and Forest Hills in Queens.

Volunteer Opportunities

Shopper

Visiting Neighbors needs volunteers to shop for seniors (the most vulnerable population). Proper protocols are in place and the volunteer will not come in contact with the senior. Volunteers can make their own flexible schedule any day or days of the week.

Shopper and Escort

Volunteers help seniors with shopping or errands, accompany them to the doctor or other appointments, provide a steady arm to lean on, as well as moral support. Internships are available for high school and college students on a year round basis.

Many schools participate in VN's Intergenerational Program, where students learn valuable job skills and life lessons, improving their self-esteem and sense of responsibility.

They are similar to audio books, but with your voice and friendly face, recorded on your phone or computer. GO's new virtual books will help students (and parents) continue the joy of reading at home. Pick an age-appropriate book; record yourself reading it aloud as you would to your own child, grandchild, niece, or nephew; upload the video yourself or send to GO and we will push out to our students; and watch the love of reading grow!

 Choose a book meant for children ages 5 – 10 (grades K - 4), and refrain from material that may be considered offensive or books with holiday themes.

Keep the length of your read-aloud an average of 10 minutes. No novels,

- Before you launch into reading, introduce yourself and briefly describe why you chose the book. Is it your favorite from childhood? How do the book's themes, characters, or illustrations resonate with you or a young reader that you

Are you motivated, high energy, patient, and committed to making a difference in the lives of young people? Then StreetSquash is the place for you! And no worries, you do not have to be a squash player to volunteer with us.



For the time being, StreetSquash programming has gone virtual – including for our 2020 Summer Discovery Program, which starts on July 6th! That means that our volunteering is operating virtually, too. Right now, we are looking for virtual volunteers interested in:

- 1-1 & Group Tutoring: Work with 1-2 students on homework help and other academic support. Volunteers are needed for all subject areas, from 6th grade Social Studies to 12th grade AP Chemistry.
- High School Mentoring: Help our older students review resumes, job search, and practice interview. Also share takeaways and tips from your own career and field.
- Middle School Mentoring: Build a bond with our younger students by chatting about life skills and offering guidance about personal interests and challenges.
- Summer Sessions: Lead a summer discovery session for our students, and help them learn a new skill or idea.

RECLAIM OUR VOTE Campaign

What is RECLAIM OUR VOTE?

The Reclaim Our Vote Campaign was officially launched in 2018 by the **Center for Common Ground** of Virginia, a 501(c)3 organization whose national partners include the NAACP, Black Voters Matter, Mi Familia Vota, VoteRiders and DemLabs.

History of the RECLAIM OUR VOTE campaign

Since late 2017, the nonpartisan Reclaim Our Vote campaign has reached out to nearly a million voters of color in states like Georgia, Alabama, Virginia, Texas and Mississippi—states with a long history of voter suppression. In December 2017, our phone bank calls helped



increase turnout among rural voters of color by 35% in the Alabama special Senate election. In 2018, teaming up with Black Voters Matter, we made 185,000 calls to Georgia voters for the midterms; about 65% of those calls resulted in votes. In 2019, 20-25% of our postcards into nine counties in North Carolina's 3rd Congressional District resulted in a voter registration.

How will we RECLAIM OUR VOTE in 2020?

This year, Reclaim Our Vote plans to expand its volunteer base and work towards a 20 percent increase in turnout among voters of color in at least four states, and a significant percentage increase in others. We started working towards this goal in 2019, in North Carolina and Virginia; in 2020 our target states are North Carolina, Texas, Arizona, Alabama, Mississippi and Georgia; our tools include postcards, phone banks, textbanks, geofencing, GOTV billboards in key areas, canvassing, rides to the polls and election monitoring.
