Dyckman Farmhouse Museum





Governors Gardener



Behind the Book



Behind the Book's mission is to inspire New York City public school students to love reading by bringing accomplished authors and their books into classrooms and creating rich, innovative literacy programs. Our programs take place in underserved public schools, are part of the class curricula and meet the Common Core Learning Standards.

The students we work with have been hit harder than most during the pandemic. It is expected that when school resumes in person in the fall, the young people in Title I schools will be the most behind in their learning.

To help combat summer slide (the loss of reading skills over summer vacation), we are giving away over 3,800 books to young people in Washington Heights.

Behind the Book is hosting Book Bash Saturday on the following dates. The event will be outside at the Mitchel Square Park at the intersection of Broadway and 166th Street.

- 9AM Noon Load the U-Haul at Behind the Book's office and help unload and set up at Mitchel Square Park - 4 Volunteers Needed
- Noon 3PM Help kids choose books and read aloud 3 Volunteers Needed
- 3PM 6PM Help kids choose books, read aloud, and pack up 6 Volunteers Needed (2 will come back to the office and unload)

NOTE: In order to volunteer, you must be vaccinated and wear a mask. We will have extra masks, hand sanitizer, and disinfectant.
