Girl Scouting builds girls of courage, confidence, and character, who make the world a better place. Founded in 1913, the Girl Scouts of Greater New York is New York City's largest girls-only leadership program, reaching over 31,000 girls ages 5 to 18 in every zip code of the five boroughs.

Virtual Programing Facilitator

Lead/Facilitate virtual programming and troop meetings as part of the GSUSA Virtual Starter Troop initiative. Starter Troops are facilitator-run troops with the goal of transitioning to a fully functioning, volunteer-led troop. Volunteers will be trained by Council Staff and facilitate multiple meetings over a span of 4-6 weeks experiencing a variety of purposeful troop activities, participating in Girl Scout traditions, and exploring various topics in accordance with the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE).

BENEFITS:

- Impact the life of a Girl Scout by inspiring them to explore new interests and experiences
- Facilitate a wide range of fascinating programs and curriculum topics
- Build skills in time management, working with youth, and leading activities with a small group
- Build your skills in digital presentation (for virtual engagement)
- Official documentation of volunteer service.

TIME COMMITMENT:

- Volunteer Onboarding Training (offered asynchronously through gsLearn): 60-90 minutes
- Virtual Starter Troop Specific Training
- Pre-meeting prep work: approximately 1-2 hours
- Girl Scout Virtual Troop Meetings: 60-90 minute meetings

PRIMARY TASKS:

- Facilitate virtual troop meetings with Girl Scouts in accordance with the GSLE
- Assist Girl Scouts in earning badges from their program level
- Build sustainable membership by supporting Girl Scouts and their families in their introduction to Girl Scouting, identifying and mentoring potential leaders, and connecting them to council staff for additional details on continuing their involvement
- Coordinate technical challenges to ensure the best possible experience for Girl Scouts
- Coordinate with council staff to ensure dates, times, and details are set up for each meeting
- Host troop meetings using a GSUSA licensed Zoom account and engage with Caregivers to ensure girl participation.



Silver Circles

Our agency's "Silver Circles" older adult computer education program provides one-on-one and group sessions to help older men and women use technology on varying devices.

As a volunteer you can expect to do:

One-On-One Computer Coaching: helping older adults through one-on-one in-person sessions with learning how to use their devices - computers, tablets, smartphones, etc. - in whatever ways fit each client's needs and interests. or

Group Assistance: helping older adults connect to our remote groups (both telephonic and via video chat) by helping them understand how to connect to groups, being available during the time of a group to assist one or more clients to get connected, as well as guiding them if they get kicked out of a group or have technical difficulties while participating.

Volunteer schedules are flexible. Once you are matched with a client,, you will then schedule an appointment time with them where you can spend an hour assisting in a coaching session.

Volunteers must:

- Have experience, patience, and passion for working with older adults and technology.
- Are willing to travel. We service the Upper East Side, East Harlem, and the Upper West Side. We also provide remote coaching over the phone!
- Have the ability to set appropriate boundaries if/when necessary.
- Bilingual English/Spanish-speaking a plus!!

New York City is home to approximately 1.64 million older adults, and the Department for the Aging (DFTA) is committed to helping them age with dignity in their homes and communities. Our mission is to eliminate ageism and ensure the quality of life of diverse older adults. We also work to support caregivers through service, advocacy, and education.

Volunteers Needed - Friendly Visitor Program

The Friendly Visitor Program provides a meaningful friendship to seniors who are no longer able to leave their homes. Volunteers chat with a homebound senior via *phone, in-person, or both,* alleviating social isolation and providing companionship for the senior, and for the volunteer, too.

Volunteers in this program commit for a period of six months, once a week for an hour. In-person volunteers must be fully vaccinated. The seniors for this program live in Washington Heights, West 110th Street to 235th Street and from the West Side to the River.
