Catholic Charities Community Services is currently responding to an influx of **asylum seekers** here in New York City.

We need personable, professional volunteers to help our Case Management team with administrative duties and client-related activities. You will primarily be escorting and greeting asylum seekers, handing out bagged lunches, or performing various office tasks to aid the case management team in the new navigation center.

What you will do:

- Greet asylum-seekers warmly--you may be the first friendly face they've seen all week
- Perform administrative duties in a fast-paced environment
- Escort clients to and from the case management floor
- Sit and communicate with clients in waiting rooms and show them around the building
- Distribute snacks, drinks, goods, swag bags, and lunch offsite at a nearby location

Preferred Skills:

- Spanish, Portuguese, and French skills highly preferred
- Empathetic, friendly demeanor
- Ability to maintain professionalism under pressure
- Flexibility to pivot between tasks
- Comfort with crowds and engaging with people from diverse cultural backgrounds
- Ability to stand/walk around for a few hours
- You might be escorting asylum seekers to a nearby Catholic Charities agency to grab a free bagged lunch after appointments
- Experience with immigrants and refugees is a plus!

Reading Partners

Reading Partners is an educational nonprofit that mobilizes community volunteers to provide one-on-one literacy tutoring to aspiring readers ages 6 - 10. The goal is to empower everyone to become lifelong readers.

Becoming a Volunteer Tutor

Becoming a volunteer tutor requires no experience as Reading Partners provides an easy-to-follow curriculum that includes all of the books, worksheets, and set-by-step lesson plans to teach an effective lesson.

While volunteering, there are Program Coordinators at each reading center and a Volunteer Hub for support and coaching along the way for the volunteers as an ongoing resource.

Reading Partners offers three tutoring options:

- In-person tutoring that takes place at one of the designated reading centers,
- Virtual tutoring,
- and a Hybrid model which includes a digital platform and in-person tutoring.
- The volunteer should have a positive attitude toward learning, diversity, and students and an ability to interact effectively with diverse student populations.
- Age requirements: 14 to unlimited age. Reading Partners asks for a commitment through the school year but there are also occasional opportunities for one-day volunteers.
- Reading Partners asks for 2 sessions per week which last 45 minutes with a student from K
 through 4, and the volunteer will work with the same student at the same time and place
 each week.

Currently Reading Partners has reading centers in 4 boroughs (except Staten Island). Volunteers can ask to be attached to a reading center in a school and borough of their choice and every effort will be made to meet this request.

Training and other Requirements: There is a Train the Tutor 1.5 hour orientation that must be completed to understand the curriculum that is utilized.

If the volunteer is over the age of 18, they must complete a Background Check which may cost \$42.00. Reading Partners may be able to provide a volunteer coupon which waives that fee.

Mock Interview Volunteer

The goal of the Mock Interview Volunteer is to help the Employment Services team assist job-seeking clients as they prepare for re-entering the workforce. Volunteers, working either one-on-one or in a group setting, provide in-person assistance to clients who are in Fortune's 2-week Job Readiness Workshop.

When: Fridays, from 1pm-4pm in person

Where: The Fortune Society, 29-76 Northern Blvd, LIC, NY

Tasks:

- Meet with clients in person at our Long Island City service center location
- Act as potential employers during mock interviews
- Determine hard and soft skills
- Provide encouraging comments to clients using the feedback form
- Teach clients how to answer difficult questions related to their justice-involvement
- Create a respectful and comfortable environment for clients

Preferred Qualifications:

- Comfortable with talking about sensitive topics with our community members
- 5+ years of professional interviewing experience
- Ideal candidate would express sincere sensitivity toward the populations represented in The Fortune Society and assist them without bias
- Strong verbal and written communication skills
- Bonus: Spanish fluency
- Must be 18+ of age

Must attend full 3 hour sessions 2x per month and commit a minimum of 6 months. Must show proof of completed COVID-19 vaccination (boosters not required).

DOROT

DOROT serves Seniors in Manhattan and Westchester County whose social networks are shrinking and need social connections. Services offered include one-time opportunities, seasonal opportunities, friendly visiting programs, help with learning technology, and legacy projects.

Legacy Project - Help an Older Adult Create a Lasting Legacy

- Legacy project volunteers work 1-1 with DOROT client to create an oral or written history, photo album, video, or recipe collection (whatever the client selects) to record meaningful memories.
- Pairs meet for 6-8 one hour sessions in person or by Zoom.
- Volunteers should have excellent listening skills and good follow-through. Writing, videography, or photography experience is a plus.

Solo Aging Program, Aging Alone Together

Help solo agers plan for the future as an Aging Alone Together host or facilitator. Hosts welcome and foster connections between participants. Facilitators lead small group discussions.

- Aging Alone Together is a 6-week program focused on maintaining social supports, health care decision-making, end-of-life choices, aging in place, and making a move. Each weekly session lasts approximately two hours.
- Hosts and facilitators should have experience with group work and will participate in training specific to the program and their role.
- A commitment to assist with 3+ 6-week series is requested. This program is offered in person and by Zoom.

Join the Response Team

- Help with errands, go on neighborhood walks, celebrate birthdays, and more.
- Fill special requests from DOROT older adults and social workers.
- Response Team volunteers receive regular emails when new opportunities—remote and in person—arise and sign up for those that match their interests and availability. All in person activities are on Manhattan's East or West Side. A commitment to 8+ activities, typically 1 hour per activity, is required.

Intergenerational Workshop

- Build community with other age 65+ volunteers and with high school students by participating in DOROT's intergenerational Programs.
- Connect with peers and Gen Z while sharing common interests.
- Choose from workshops such as storytelling, music, art, and current events. Workshops are 1-2 hours weekly, in person at DOROT or via Zoom, and start the week of October 19th.

For In-person volunteering opportunities, proof of vaccination and one booster for COVID is required.

There are two Orientation Sessions offered per month by Zoom, one during the day and one at night—consult the website for specifics. www.dorotusa.org/volunteer or e-mail to volunteers@dorotusa.org
